The Fruit of the Spirit is Patience

Over the past 2 months, with shelter in place, maybe, our patience is wearing thin. But remember that patience is demonstrated as we wait cheerfully or give grace to others even when they make mistakes. Patience is giving grace to others (even people that aren't easy to get along with) and loving them even when they make mistakes.


The Bible tells us in this passage that patience is a fruit of the Spirit. If we are saved, the Holy Spirit is living inside of us, and we can be patient people. This does not mean that we will be patient all the time! But as we come to know God more and more, we change! Patience becomes part of the kind of person we are. With the Spirit living inside of us, He gives the power to be patient!

In some translations of the Bible, the list of the fruit of the Spirit uses the word *forbearance* for patience. *Forbearance* also includes self-control, restraint, and tolerance, implying that we have a choice about how we respond to God and others in our times of waiting.

When we are struggling to be patient with another person, we should remember God's patience toward us. As sinners, we have offended God. The Bible says that we have even hated Him. So, God had every right to be angry with us, but instead He showed just how awesome His patience is by saving us! Every day we still wrong God and He still is patient with us. So, may that truth sink deep into our hearts and motivate us to be patient with others!

Job 4: 1-11

Then Eliphaz the Temanite replied: 2 "If someone ventures a word with you, will you be impatient? But who can keep from speaking? 3 Think how you have instructed many, how you have strengthened feeble hands. 4 Your words have supported those who stumbled; you have strengthened faltering knees. 5 But now trouble comes to you, and you are discouraged; it strikes you, and you are dismayed. 6 Should not your piety be your confidence and your blameless ways your hope? 7 "Consider now: Who, being innocent, has ever perished? Where were the upright ever destroyed? 8 As I have observed, those who plow evil and those who sow trouble reap it. 9 At the breath of God they perish; at the blast of his anger they are no more.




Job 42: 1-5



Dear God,


